Third Class in Indian Railways Gandhi

Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi (1869 – 1948) was the pre-eminent political and spiritual leader of India during the Indian independence movement. He was the pioneer of *satyagraha* – resistance to tyranny through mass civil disobedience. This philosophy was firmly founded upon *ahimsa*, or total nonviolence, and led India to independence and inspired movements for civil rights and freedom across the world. Gandhi is commonly known around the world as Mahatma Gandhi and in India also as Bapu. There, he is officially honoured as the Father of the Nation; his birthday, the 2nd October, is commemorated in India as Gandhi Jayanti, a national holiday.

This collection contains 6 pieces of his early writings: *Third Class in Indian Railways*, *Vernaculars as Media of Instruction*, *Swadeshi*, *Ahimsa*, *The Moral Basis of Cooperation*, and *National Dress*.
